About the Workshop:

This one-day workshop offers a unique opportunity to introduce participants to an innovative and refreshingly creative approach to understanding and working with children, young people and adults who have been impacted by adverse developmental experiences, trauma and neglect. The Neurosequential Model of Therapeutics (NMT), originally developed by Dr Bruce Perry (ChildTrauma Academy), not only has clinical relevance to understanding the profound effects of early adversity on the developing brain (from conception through to early adulthood), but also offers crucial insights into how we can scaffold and sequence relationally rich therapeutic interventions and educational activities.

This workshop will provide a concise overview of the core principles of neurodevelopment and how this relates to hierarchical brain development. Participants can also expect to be able to differentiate between state-based and stage-based developmental functioning as well as develop a basic understanding of the clinical importance of building a Neurosequential brain map/metric when planning/pacing therapeutic interventions and enrichment experiences. Overall, this workshop will help participants determine the strengths and vulnerabilities of a child, young person or adult in order to create an individually tailored plan of treatment that matches developmental need. Time will be given to discuss the practical implications of the Neurosequential Model and participants will be offered the opportunity to present case examples from their own clinical practice.

Key learning outcomes:

- Understand basics of sequential brain organisation, structure and function.
- Identify differential impacts of trauma and neglect on developing brain.
- Understand developmental impacts of sensitised stress response networks on bonding and attachment.
- Creating optimal relational 'space' for learning, development and healing.
